"At the beginning, I worked in the restaurant business," says Kola. Soon after he met his wife, they opened up a restaurant of their own, however in 2004, they ended up closing the restaurant.

"One night we were out for dinner with our friends," explains Kola, "where we met the owner of a company looking for a kitchen and bathroom designer that had knowledge of 2020 Design. None of us knew what 2020 Design was at the time, and once he explained, my wife quickly said, 'my husband knows how.'"

In 2005, Kola was hired as a designer for that company. At the time, they were using 2020 Design 6.4. Kola began to read the book that was released with the 2020 Design program disc and realized that it was a simplified version of AutoCAD with specifications for this line of industry.

Soon after learning and understanding the program, Kola started to gain sales. By 2011, he was able to open up his own business, KB Designs, which is his greatest achievement and he's enjoyed every minute of it.
